THE WELL OF HOPE – in 2004 I founded the Well project. Since its conception we have able to build 2 deep water wells and a clinic in the village of Sabi, in the Gambia West Africa also a clinic. Also, along the way, we have been able to help many, many unfortunate people by supplying gift vouchers and buying of trikes for disabled people. We have also made regular donations to our local lifeboat, hospital, Guide Dogs, Air ambulance and a local hospice and even supplied wheelchairs and other useful items. This has been achieved by your generosity by putting your 5 pence and pennies in the wooden well which sits on the side of control desk in ABC. This year will be concentrating in our local area because of the difficulties that this Christmas and winter will bring. Some families will need help with food, lighting heating, et cetera. So I appeal to you, please, please, put what you can into the Well, so that we can as a church, help our own people. Whatever you can give, God will reward you. All I can do is say is "thank you" on their behalf. Ian
