TODAY'S SERVICE – In this Sunday's service we will be lighting our third advent calendar which means Christmas is now only 14 days away. The title of Simon's talk this week is “Feet bringing Good News” based on Isaiah 52:6-10. This is a reminder that 2000 years ago, there were no daily newspapers, no TV, no postman (not unlike now) and even no internet. The news was delivered verbally and often by a messenger who came on foot. It is also a reminder that “Good news” is still best shared in person and on foot! Perhaps we all need to take this to heart and realise that sharing the Good news of Jesus is meant to be shared and is the responsibility of us. Food for thought.
