

REBUILDING HOPE

Serving the Middle East with medical and humanitarian help
Samara Levy

TODAY'S WORSHIP SERVICE - Today we welcome our guest speaker. Samara Levy. For anyone who hasn't heard of Samara's Aid, it began in 2014 when God called Samara three times over 8 months to "start collecting" aid to send to Syria. Samara was a stay-at-home mum with two young boys with no experience whatsoever. It started with a vision to fill one lorry of aid, but since then it has quickly grown into a larger project which provides medical and humanitarian aid, currently focused on Syria. Samara's team have sent 110 consignments (artic lorries to Iraq, and 40' containers and ambulances shipped to Syria) carrying clothes, shoes, bedding, toiletries/hygiene items, essential medical equipment, ambulances and school equipment. She has also provided four small emergency field hospitals in different locations, at different times during the conflict. Samara's team also support food farming projects and runs an outreach centre for orphans and widows in Syria which feeds and educates 40-70 orphans every day as well as providing livelihood training for widows. The centre has proved such a success that the team are building a second in a different location. They are also about to open their first permanent medical centre, which is the first stage towards designing and building a new hospital.

The aid provided serves vulnerable people, and our teams serve everyone in need regardless of their faith, political views, gender, ethnicity or other defining categories. Our aim is to demonstrate the unconditional love of God to people who are in great need.

Since starting this work, Samara has visited Syria many times, one of the most dangerous war zones of our generation, which has the highest number of kidnappings and killings of humanitarian workers in the world and in 2016, 2/3rds of the world's attacks on healthcare took place in Syria.
