**Elijah IV: Prevailing Prayer**

**I Kings 18:41-46**

**THIS WEEKEND'S WORSHIP SERVICE** – Simon's band will be leading worship before Simon returns to our series entitled "Living Securely in an insecure world." Today we reach part four of the series as we embark on a journey through one of the most powerful and instructive passages in the Old Testament: 1 Kings 18:41-46. This narrative is a vivid reminder of the power of prevailing prayer. It is a story that takes us to the top of Mount Carmel, where the prophet Elijah teaches us about the perseverance, faith, and trust required in our prayer lives. In this passage, we witness a dramatic showdown between the forces of drought and the promise of rain, between human desperation and divine provision. Elijah's unwavering faith and relentless prayer are a testament to the incredible power of prayer that refuses to give up, even when the situation seems impossible which is why Simon's talk is entitled "Prevailing Prayer".
