BMS NEWS - Carlos Tique Jones' work with CBM, (Mozambique Baptist Convention) as a trainer in project management, helping business owners, church leaders and young people, has changed many lives, but sadly BMS will be ending their work in Mozambique. This is because they have been unable to send funding to CBM for more than a year because CBM,- the Mozambican Baptist Convention-, have not passed financial due diligence checks, which means that for Carlos, despite his continuing to work hard and having done an amazing job even with no grant funding, in future he would face having less of both impact and sustainability if he were to continue.. (He had shared stories of 25 new believers being baptized on Palm Sunday).

The hope is that the impact of his work with many agricultural projects will continue for years to come, like for a lady called Lucia with seven children who is enjoying the fruit from ten trees she received as saplings. Carlos appreciates all the support he has received in the development ministry he has been part of and which has spurred him on, but now needs to stop as he faces upcoming treatment for health problems and BMS will aim to support him as best they can during this time. BMS encourages us to prayerfully consider helping one of their other mission workers with prayer and support.
