

NEXT WEEKEND'S HARVEST FAMILY THANKSGIVING SERVICE – The theme of our Harvest service will be thanksgiving for God's amazing provision as a family of Christian believers. This service will be led by John and myself supported by Band 4 which means Helen, David, Barbara, Larry and Ray. This service will include Breakfast Time which is open to all ages from 9.30am. Breakfast time is a place to encourage Christians and non-Christians alike, to share in some food together, before the family services begin. It is about using the gifts of relationships, hospitality, generosity, and kindness to make people feel valued. It is about helping people feel that they 'belong.' As relationships develop, the sharing of one's faith may also emerge in time.

YOUR HARVEST DONATIONS – Your donations will be going to the Bognor Food bank. For your information, each week Bognor Regis Foodbank gives emergency food parcels to around 100 people about a third of whom are children. Currently about 25% of the people they see are homeless or insecurely housed. The team also offer income maximisation support through their financial inclusion adviser, as well as seeking to signpost people to other sources of support. The items they most require are long life fruit Juice, long life milk, jars of pasta sauce, tinned meat, tinned fruit, tinned milk pudding, tinned vegetables, sweets/biscuits, and toiletries.
