**NEXT WEEKEND'S BAPTISMAL SERVICE** – Next weekend we have three ladies going through the waters of Baptism. First up is Christine Austin, followed by Rosanne Brown and then Jaycee Hudson. Please pray for them during the week as this is a very significant step for each of them. If you are not sure what believer's baptism is all about – this might help. Believer's baptism is a very special moment on the journey of faith. It is a moment when God's presence and blessing meets us, and when we make our personal commitment of faith in Jesus as Lord. It signifies the end of our old life and of being born again to new life in Christ. Normally taking place by full immersion in water, it speaks of repentance and cleansing, of being united with Christ in his death and resurrection, and of witnessing to the call of God upon our lives. Baptism is also about receiving God's Spirit for service in the church and in the world. Let me ask you, if you haven't been baptised as a believer, what is stopping you? If you want to know more, then talk to me or one of the deacons. We are hoping to have another baptismal service early in the new year. Derek

YOUR HARVEST DONATIONS – Your donations will be going to the Bognor Food bank. For your information, each week Bognor Regis Foodbank gives emergency food parcels to around 100 people about a third of whom are children. Currently about 25% of the people they see are homeless or insecurely housed. The team also offer income maximisation support through their financial inclusion adviser, as well as seeking to signpost people to other sources of support. The items they most require are long life fruit Juice, long life milk, jars of pasta sauce, tinned meat, tinned fruit, tinned milk pudding, tinned vegetables, sweets/biscuits, and toiletries.
